From Pixels to Paper

A photograph captures a slice in time of the world that the photographer sees, feels and experiences. The photographer speaks a language that is not bound by native tongue or, as I learned recently, by age.

December of 2015 was the first time my two-year-old daughter, Olivia, experienced Grand Illumination. This is a day filled with activities but culminates at dusk with an impressive fireworks display. It marks the beginning of the Christmas season in our hometown of Williamsburg, Virginia. My wife and I were not sure how Olivia would react to the loud fireworks but she absolutely loved it. As usual, I brought my camera and tripod to capture the experience. Of the

many images I made, this is my favorite.

As I often

do, Heft this image open in Photoshop once I was done editing. I do this to let the image "cool down" and return to it later. Olivia came into my office when the image was still on screen and she exclaimed, "The fire-

works were

really loud!" This was the best reaction to a photograph I have ever made! Olivia's response was pure emotion and it was a comment that transcended things we often talk about like composition or color. Olivia doesn't have the language yet to comment on these things; her response was a statement on how the image brought her back to a special moment we all shared.

Olivia asked to see the fireworks picture on my computer for the next several days so I made a print for her. I hung it in our family room at her height. I showed her what I made for her and explained she can look at the print anytime to help remember that special moment. The fireworks picture has been up for several months and I still catch her pause in front of it and say things like, "The fireworks were really loud!" "It was really cold" and "I sat in my stroller".


I say all this to illustrate the point that a photograph can and should be much more than a file on a hard drive. Digital sensors have replaced film and photography has naturally become a less tangible medium. Personally, I think it is wonderful that we can make images so quickly and receive immediate feedback. This is great for many reasons but I believe that photography should still be a tangible medium at some level. Creating and sharing your im-


